Eskimo Lamps

It is believed that the Eskimo lamp was invented before its possessors emigrated from their original home, which was probably farther south and near the sea coast. But the form of the lamp becomes more specialized the higher the latitude is. The lamps of southern Alaska have a wick edge of 2 inches, while those of Point Barrow and northern Greenland have wick edges of 17 to 30 inches. The lamp is employed for melting snow and ice to obtain drinking water, warming, drying skins and in the arctic. It is also a social factor and the sign of the family unit, each head of the family having his lamp.
