WHEAT EXPORTS INCREASE

In ten months since the cereal export season opened there have been 239 vessels carrying 36,785,964 bushels of wheat, valued at \$47,546,887, in the Portland wheat export trade, according to a statement of the Traffic department of the Port of Portland Commission.

This was a substantial increase over the wheat exports for the Columbia River district during the entire seasons of 1926-27 and 1925-26. During the 1926-27 season, 28,383,000 bushels went from the river, while during the previous season shipments totaled 17,832,000 bushels.

It is reported that the Pacific Tel. & Tel. Co. will spend \$3,500,000 in Oregon this year.

RACNG PIGIONS FAST

Chipman Birds Average 54.55 Miles an Hour for 200 Miles

Six racing pigeons of R. L. Chipman of the Western Battery station were released at Ione, by the American Railway Express agent, who wired "Weather cool and cloudy with light west wind." Five of the pigeons bropped on the home loft at W1047 Gorbon at 11:03 a. m., making an average of 54.55 miles an hour for the 200 miles. Six seasons verified the arrival of the birds which showed little signs of fatigue.

"According to available records this is the fastest time ever made to Spokane from a 200 mile station. Two weeks previously the same birds flew from Pasco in 2 hours and 21 minutes, an air line distance of 128 miles said Mr. Chipman.

"Due to their exceptionally fine physical condition they will skip the 316 mile station and go to the 425 mile at Ashland, Ore., for the next race."

One Is About Gone

It was never a common species, says Nature Magazine, and the effect of settlement and unrestricted trapping has been its virtual extinction over most of its range; yet it still has little protection, and the high price that the skin commands insures its continued pursuit.
