In ten months since the cereal export season opened there have heen 239 vessels carrying 36 785' 964 dushels of wheat, valued at \$47.546,887, in the Portland wheat export trade, according to a state ment of the Trafic department of the Port of Por-land Commis-

This was a substantial increase over the wheat exports for the Columbia River district during the entire seasons of 1926 27 and 1925- 26. During the 1926-27 season, 28,383,000 bushels went from the river, while buring the IONE LODGE No.120, A. F. &A, M. previous season shipments totaled 17,832,000 dushels.

#### RACNG PIGIONS FAST

Chipman Birds Average 54.55 Miles an Hour for 200 Miles

Six racing pigeons of R. L. Chipman of the Westrn Battery station were released at Ione, by the American Railway Express agent, who wired "Weather cool nad cloudy with light west wind."

Five of -he pigeons bropped on the home lhft at W1047 Gorbon at 11:03 a. m , making an average of 54 55 miles an hour for the 200 miles. Six peasons verified oe arrsval of the birds which showed little signs of fatigue.

"According to available records this is the fastest time ever made Secy., Verda Ritchie, Tacas., Etta to Spoksne from a 200 mile sta tion. Two weeks greviously the same birds flew from Pasco in 2 hours and 21 minutes, an air line distance of 128 miles said Mr. Chipman.

Due to their exceptionally fine ghysical cont i ion they will skip the 316 mile station and go to the 425 mile at Ashland, Ore., for the next race."
