Watercress Good Food

The list of foods the doctor says you should eat has been augmented by a new one, watercress. This familiar garnish for meat and salad is a remarkably rich source of the vitamins necessary for growth and of the scurvy-preventing vitamin C. Dr. Katherine H. Toward and P. Eggleton, of the University of London, have found it contains small quantities of vitamin D as well in its small green leaves. The green shows considerable seasonal variation, however. In its growth-promoting properties, the investigators have found, being more effective with laboratory animals in this respect in spring and summer than in winter.

Breaking Ocean Cables

Researches with reference to the breaking of telegraphic cables have revealed the facts that there are parts of the ocean bed, particularly on steep slopes along the edges of the continents, where great changes frequently occur. The importance of properly selecting the location of a cable is shown by the fact, cited often in this relation, that the military and naval reserves were called out in Australia once, when the simultaneous interruption of two cables cut off communication with the rest of the world for 10 days and gave rise to the fear that war had broken out in Europe.
