## Obey Life's Laws and Keep Spirit of Youth

There has been no improvement in the longevity of human life in the last one hundred years for those who reach the age of fifty, a writer in *Physiologist Culture Magazine* maintains. By improving the mortality record of the earlier years of life, i.e. adults, the average span of life has nearly doubled in the last two or three centuries. But, he says, the chances for life for a man of middle age have not improved in the last century.

"The proper way to prolong life," he declares, "is to get more life, to live more completely, to make yourself more alive in every part of your bodily organism."

"There is much about the human body that is beyond our understanding. The most learned anatomical expert finds that the more he studies the body the more he realizes how numerous are the unsolvable mysteries that are hidden within it. Then why tamper with this marvelously constructed organism? Why not try to interpret the laws of life and health as indicated by the endeavors of the body itself to build and maintain health?"

"Then the spirit of youth can be retained on and on, at times even to old age; for life is worth little or nothing when the decrepitude of senility creeps upon you."

## HOLY CITY SCENES ODD TO WESTERNER

Visitor Must Remember It Is an Oriental Town.

The first impression which Jerusalem makes upon the visitor depends largely on the visitor's previous familiarity with oriental towns. If he comes fresh from western scenes and customs and here for the first time looks upon the East he will find many strange sights, sounds and smells to which to adjust himself. Some will shock him.

The uncleanness, the negligence of sanitation, the acceptance of filth and vermin as a matter of course; the appalling poverty, blindness and disease; the shiftless, sodden figures that bestrew the streets; the shameless begging, aided by all the pity-producing artifices that can be devised; the bizarre marks of racial and religious distinction, such as the straggling, uncut forelocks of the Polish Jews or the knotted-back hair of the Greek priests—scores of such things will smite his eyes and nose.

If he is incapable of overpassing these strangenesses he may as well return where he can feel the congenial familiarity of Broadway or the homelikeness of Main street anywhere. If, however, he has learned to look with generous eyes on all sorts and conditions of men he soon will see light upon Jerusalem. The conditions as to sanitation are infinitely better under British rule than they have ever been before, and they are constantly improving. Anyway, the idea that cleanliness is next to godliness is western; in a country like Palestine where, even in Jerusalem, there is barely enough water to drink, it is a bit absurd; and admirable personalities can develop under conditions where such an idea is as yet an unutilized alien.

As for happiness, there is probably as much per capita in Jerusalem, or even in these poverty-stricken, mud-brick Arab villages, with all their squalor, as there is in the city of New York.

In the end even the traveler who at first is shocked discovers the real Jerusalem. Its narrow, winding, climbing streets; its thronged bazaars packed along the traffic ways or crowded under colonnades built by Crusaders to house pilgrims; its endless riot of color in costumes that represent many faiths and races; its fascinating amalgam of strange faces, strange animals, strange clothes and strange accents—all these fill the eye until the Strand or Fifth Avenue seems by contrast very dull, drab, standardized and monotonous.—Dr. Harry Emerson Fosdick in the *Ladies' Home Journal*.
