M., the 11th day of August, 1928, and immediately thereafter the bids received will be publicly opened by the County Court, at the County Court Room in the Court House in Heppner, Oregon, for the purchase of an issue of bonds of Morrow County, for the construction of permanent roads therein in the sum of One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) said bonds to be in denominations of One thousand dollars (\$1,000) each, numbered 1 to 100 inclusive, to bear date of August 1, 1928, and to mature serially in numerical order at the rate of Five thousand dollars (\$5,000) on the first day of August in each of the years 1934 to 1963 inclusive, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed five per cent (5 per cent) per annum, payable semiannually on the first days of February and August, principal and interest payable in United States gold coin at the office of the County Treasurer in Heppner, Oregon, or at the Fiscal Agency of the State of Oregon in New York City.

MORROW COUNTY AT OREGON STATE COLLEGE

The annual report of the registrar, E. B. Lemon, shows that out of a total enrollment of 2818 long term students at Oregon State Agricultural college in the school year 1927-28, Morrow Co. was represented by 25. Total enrollment for the year, including the 1927 summer session and various short courses reached 5311 as compared with 5087 the previous year. Every county in the state as well as 25 other states were represented in the total. Students were also in Corvallis from five foreign countries; China, India, Canada, Russia and Korea, and from Alaska, The Philippines, Hawaii and the District of Columbia. The latest report for this year's summer session shows students from all but four counties of Oregon and from 19 other states. Total registration is 1385 including special and junior session students and 707 regular adult students. Of the latter 3 are from Morrow County.
