ages around 4,000,000 cases per
annum and brings into the state
about \$20,000,000 of outside mon-
ey. All this money remains in the
state with the exception of the
amounts paid out for sugar and
tin plate. Cans are manufactured
in the Portland plant of the
American Can Company. All class-
es of labor are employed. During
the summer season a large num-
ber of college and high school
students are employed. Oregon
canned goods are known the
world over. The finished products
are shipped to all prominent Uni-
ted States centers, and approxi-
mately 20 per cent of the pack-
age is exported. Steady increase has
been noted in the size of the pack-
age and it is safe to estimate that
this ratio of increase will contin-
ue as the years go by. The quali-
ty of Oregon canned goods is not
excelled by packers anywhere in
the world.
