Contented absorption in some activity is good for the disposition; when we are absorbed we don't stop to bother about small worries.—The American Magazine.

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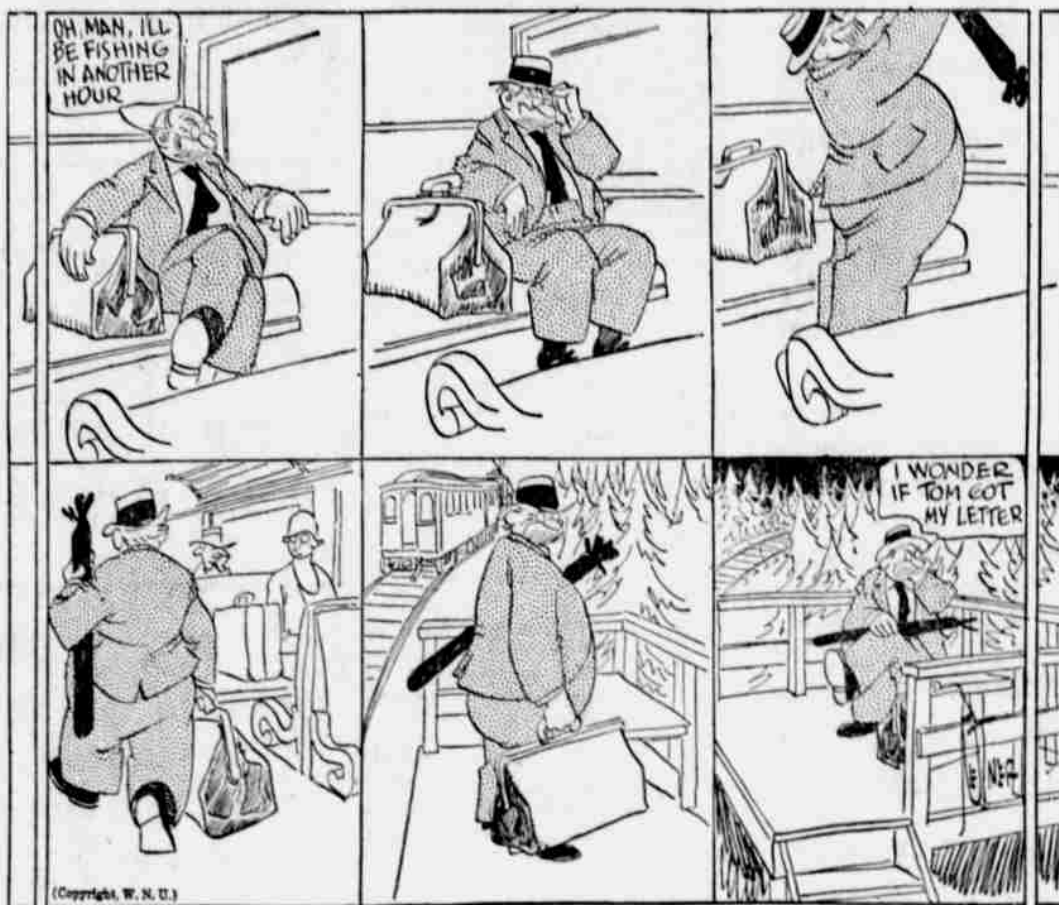
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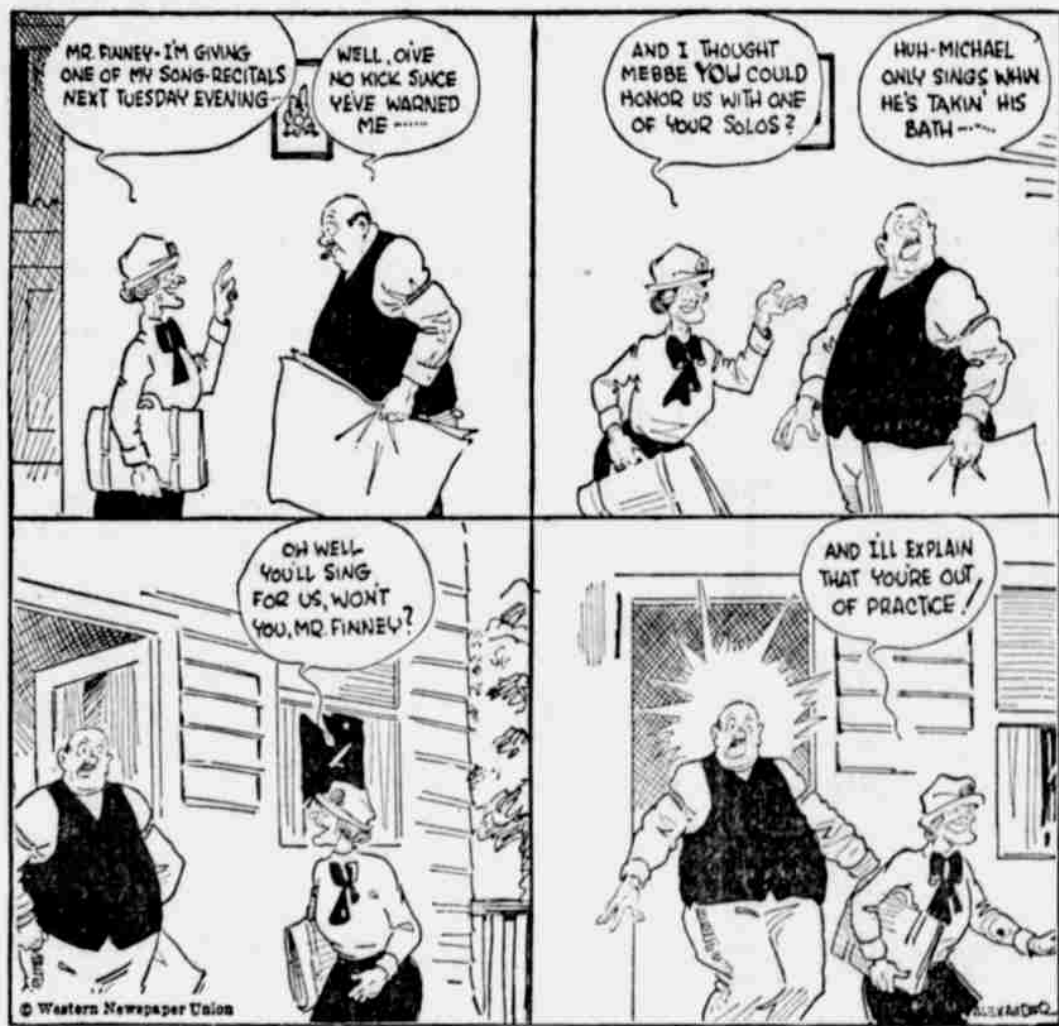

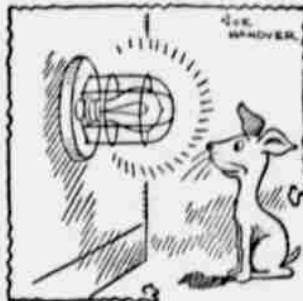
