## THE WRONG WAY TO FIGHT EPIDEMICS - FROM OREGON STATE BOARD OF HEALTH

Almost any day during the con-  
tagious disease period, from Sep-  
tember to May, you may pick up  
a newspaper and find an item  
that the schools have been closed  
to fight some communicable dis-  
ease.

When you read an item like  
that you can make up your mind  
of two things about that  
town; either it has not provided  
its school system with health ser-  
vice or the health officials have  
not learned one of the first  
things they need to know about  
handling epidemics. Closing the  
schools is the wrong way to fight  
epidemics.

What happens when the schools  
are closed, either for the regular  
vacation or on account of a con-  
tagious disease scare, is that the  
children are left free to follow  
their own devices. They seek am-  
usement. They attend motion  
picture theaters, play among  
themselves in the neighborhood,  
ride in the street cars, go shop-  
ping in crowded stores with their  
mothers, have parties, go to the  
church and Sunday school; in  
short they do everything they  
have been doing except go to  
school.

If the city or community is pro-  
vided with proper health service  
in the schools, the cases are dis-  
covered early and traced back to  
their source. Of course it is not  
possible to trace every case, but  
it is definitely known where and  
with whom the child has been.

The old method of fighting an  
epidemic was to close the schools,  
however when the schools are  
closed cases of communicable dis-  
ease are more easily overlooked  
or concealed. When the schools  
are open these cases are discover-  
ed by the school teachers and the

### DR. EVANS OUT WITH HOT DENIAL OF AL SMITH CHARGES

For days certain propagan-  
da agencies have filled the news-  
papers of the United States with  
articles charging that the Ku  
Klux Klan was being financed  
by the Republican party to make  
a whispering campaign against  
Governor Alfred E. Smith. The  
fact that for years we have been  
maligned by such agencies caus-  
ed us to ignore these statements.  
Now however, since they have  
been advanced by Governor Smith  
the responsible head of the Dem-  
ocratic party, we cannot longer  
remain silent.

The Klan has never in its his-  
tory received one dollar for any  
purpose whatsoever, that did not  
come from one of the following  
sources: [1] From its Klactoken  
or membership donation. [2]  
From Dues. [3] From Klans.

Neither the Republican party  
nor the Democratic party, neither  
any individual or corporation has  
ever directly or indirectly fur-  
nished a single dollar to the Klan  
for any purpose whatsoever. The  
Klan seeks no political prefer-  
ment and has no political affilia-  
tions.

For years we have been fight-  
ing to preserve Americanism  
against subversion by un-Amer-  
ican agencies and ideas. Our fight  
against Governor Smith is made  
because he represents these agen-  
cies and believes these ideas.

Because of these facts the Klan  
has for years been publicly fight-  
ing Gov. Smith by the widest  
possible dissemination of the  
truth. We have shouted, not whis-  
pered, and Governor Smith need  
not now be surprised that mil-  
lions of the American people now  
know that he is unfitted for the  
presidency.

His statement that the Ku  
Klux Klan is unqualified and  
wholly false. His attempt to raise  
the religious issue and to arouse  
hatred is clearly the desperate ex-  
pedient of a man who knows he  
is beaten.
