Amazing Fertility

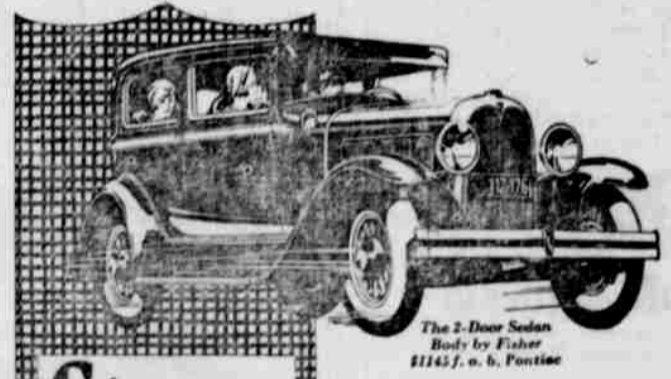
White ants are the most productive of all insects, having been known to lay eggs at the rate of 80,000 a day for a month.
