Social Science Solution to Peace Problem

War Not Only Wicked, But Futile, Says Dr. Hall, President of University of Oregon, in Series of Articles

This is the last of a series of six articles written for this paper by Dr. Arnold Bennett Hall, president of the University of Oregon, on the problem of international peace. Dr. Hall is an authority in this field, and was one of the founders of the Social Science Research Council of America.

The final implication of an effective system of social control among the nations is the availability of a potential force to be used against any member of the group that defies its authorities or power. This need not necessarily be military force. There are always the possibilities of a financial or commercial boycott. World opinion is not sufficient as a



Dr. Hall coercive force against an offending state. On the other hand, force, not backed by world opinion, is ineffectual. In other words, force cannot be used except as the expression of general sentiment, and if we have that, it is rarely necessary. Under such conditions the presence of potential power will usually be sufficient. One of the great weaknesses of democratic states is a faithless confidence in the omnipotence of legislative fiat. Because a state has back of it its military power and because of an omnipotence too frequently attributed to a majority in democratic countries, legislation has frequently attempted the impossible. Such attempts result in whatever's evasion, corruption of public officials, disregard for law, and a weakening of the authority and prestige of organized government. These evils are pointed out in order to emphasize the importance of restricting any proposed system of social control to those things upon which there is a general agreement of opinion and whose execution will be in harmony with the general tendencies of human behavior.

The consciousness of power that might come to an international organization might very easily lead it

to a conscious desire to impose its will upon the destinies of other states, relying for its execution upon the force at its command. Anyone familiar with the literature of international organization will recognize how easy it is to brush aside certain fundamental difficulties merely by the presumption of an overwhelming force at the back of the call for some international authority. Such an abuse of power leads only to friction, disaster, and warfare and not to peace, security and understanding.

In conclusion, I want to sound a challenge to the social scientist to make his full contribution to the problem of social control. Scientific method as applied to material sciences has in the last two centuries revolutionized the world. The last century or inventive genius applied to material science, has made more changes in human life than was witnessed by the two thousand years before. In the world war we saw that scientific method had evolved instruments of destruction more dangerous and terrible than any the world had ever known. The next war will probably be fought largely from the air. No distinction can be made in aerial warfare between combatants and non-combatants, between soldiers and between women and children. The nation that secures the time of little else a campaign of extermination. It would seem that modern science by producing engines of destruction so powerful and terrific that they threaten the very civilization that gave them birth.

Our only hope is in an effective system of social control by which we can control the creator, of death. The power-producing sciences have reached a point in the development of destructive power that calls for perfection of the power-controlling sciences equal to the task of making those forces the servants, rather than the masters of mankind. If the social sciences, following the same objectivity in method, master the technique of social engineering in such a way that the great basic hopes and aspirations of humanity may be made to prevail against the passing passion of the moment, there is reason to believe that the eternal hope of man to secure back peace and security may yet become an actual achievement rather than an irrealistic dream.
