MRS. TROEDSON DIES

Venerated Mother Passes Through The Shadow

Mrs. Christina Troedson, widow of the late Johannes Troedson, passed away at her home in Ione Wednesday evening, May 7. Mrs. Troedson had been in failing health for some time. Funeral services were held in the Congregational church at 10:30 a. m., May 11, Rev. Stanley Moore, of the Episcopal church at Heppner officiating. Interment was in the Old Fellows' cemetery at Ione.

Christina Troedson was born in Skone, Sweden, on February 5, 1851. She came to the United States in 1875, making her home in California.

She was married to John Carlson in 1876 and to this union one child was born, John Alfred

Carlson, of King City, Cal. Mr. Carlson died three months before his son was born.

On January 19, 1884, she married Johannes Troedson of San Francisco, Cal. and to this union three children were born; Clara J. Smouse, deceased; Anna C. Smouse, Ione, Oregon; Carl F. Troedson, Ione, Oregon.

She came with her husband to Morrow County in October, 1889 and has lived near Ione ever since.

Mr. Troedson died October 23, 1927. Mrs. Troedson was a life long member of the Lutheran church. She leaves to mourn her loss, one daughter, two sons,
