DOUBLE DROWNING

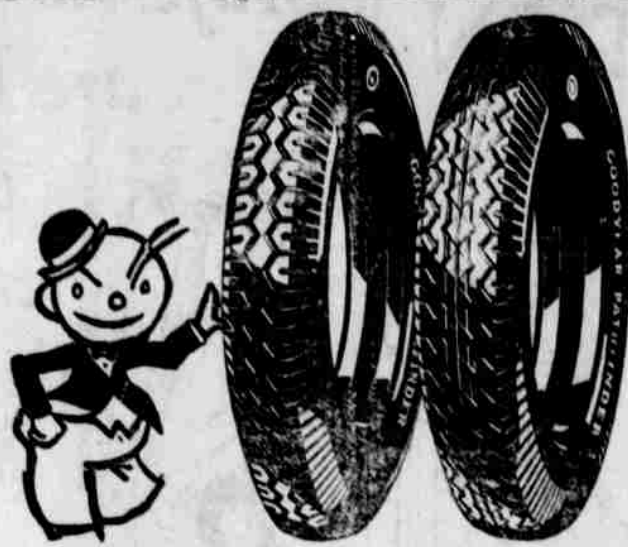
Robison first noticed her in the

exhausted state he tried to save
her but could not. From the shore
Mrs. Robison, frightened and
helpless witnessed the tragedy.

Miss Stange's body was recov-
ered in about twenty minutes,
but the efforts of the friends
failed to resuscitate her. Glenn's
body was not found until early
the next morning. Both bodies
were taken to Heppner, where
they were prepared for burial.

Funeral services for Glenn
Robison were held in the Ione
Baptist church, Tuesday morn-
ing, at ten o'clock. Interment
was made in the Maryhill, Wash.
cemetery, Tuesday afternoon.
Rev. Mr. Jordan of Maryhill had
charge of the service. He was
assisted by Rev. W. W. Head,
pastor of the Congregational
church in Ione. Rev. Jordan was
formerly the pastor of the Rob-
ison family and had preached the
funeral sermon for this boy's grand
father. Relatives who attended
from out of town were a brother
of Mr. Robison, E. Robison, and
two sisters, Miss Florence and
Mrs. Goss.

Miss Eva Stange's body was
shipped to Longview, Wash.,
Tuesday night. Funeral services
were held at Longview, Thurs-
day afternoon. Eva was the eld-
est daughter of Mr. and Mrs.
Hallick Stange. The family lived
near Ione and only three years
ago moved to Longview. She
leaves to mourn her loss, besides
her father and mother, two sis-
ters and a brother.
