zero.

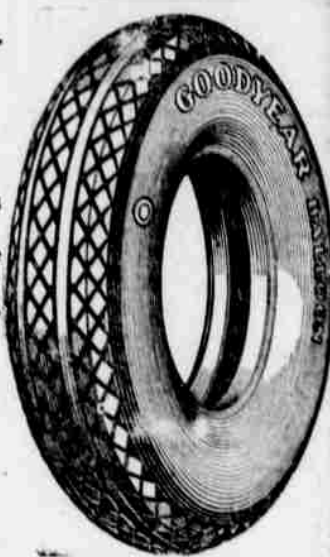
