Ireland's Famous Hill
Tara is the name of a hill in County Meath, Ireland. It was here that the tribal convention of the Irish kings was established by Ollam Fulkán about 900 B. C. According to tradition the palace of Tara was 900 feet square, containing 150 apartments and 150 dormitories. The early kings of Ireland were said to be crowned here and tradition further states that Tara at the time of the advent of St. Patrick to Ireland was the principal seat of Druidism in Ireland. It is said to have been abandoned through the curse of St. Ruidán, 450, on account of its idolatry.

Amber and Meerschaum
Amber can be made to burn when heated to a high temperature in the air. It is a fossil resin from trees of the pine family and is dug up from the shores of the Baltic sea and the North sea and a few other places. It is a compound of carbon, hydrogen and oxygen. Meerschaum is a compound of magnesium, silicon and oxygen and resembles a white clay. It is found chiefly in Asia Minor, where it occurs in masses of clay. Of course, the only connection between the two substances is the fact that they are both used in making pipes.

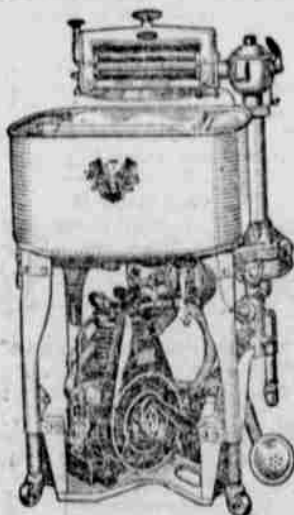
