Jungle Monarchs Lose

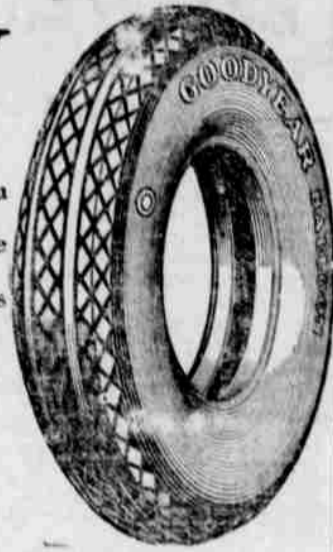
Ferocity in Daylight
