headquarters and went to Crater Lake. Here they spent some time. Mr. Balsiger and the two young men went down to the water's edge. They say as do many others, that it is one mile long and seven miles back. Because of the forest fires, the red glow above and the deep blue of the water below—the scene was one never to be forgotten. During the night which they spent there, the night prowlers made their usual visit, overturning the garbage cans and searching for choice morsels.

From Crater Lake the party drove southwest to Medford. At Kerby, they called on Mrs. Inez Freeland, who is Mrs. Omar Riitman's mother. Then on to Grants Pass and the Oregon Caves. It took two hours time to explore the caves which extend back a distance of 1400 feet. As one enters he goes down 30 or 40 feet, but as he passes deeper into the cave he climbs upward till he is 150 feet above the entrance. There are many strange formations, some resembling vegetables others, animals and at one place Nebuchadnezzar may be seen on his beautiful throne.

From Grants Pass they drove to Crescent City, California,

which, Mr. Balsiger says, is a wideawake booming town. Both going into and leaving Crescent City they drove through the wonderful redwood forest.

From here the way led north through timbered and open lands with many well kept dairy farms. At Riverton they hunted up their old friends, the Tucker family. Mr. Tucker is principal of the Riverton school; this being his fourth year. Miss Esther Tucker is a student in Willamette University this year.

They continued north to Reed's port, then east across the mountains to Drain. At Eugene, the University and at Corvallis, the State College, were of interest. At Daton they visited the old blockhouse, now filled with relics but which at one time stood in Grande Ronde and was used by General Sheridan.

At Newberg they visited the Ise Howard family and the Mc Neys. In Portland they called on Mrs. Clock and Mrs. Wrex Hickock.

They returned home Tuesday the day the smoke from forest fires was so dense. From Multnomah Falls to Arlington, they were compelled to use lights on their car, and they say that it was a weird sight with the dark near the ground and the red glow of the fire above. They found good roads and good camping places all the way, but Mr. Bal-
