BUDGET NOTICE City of Ione

Budget, Covering Estimated Expenses of Proposed Tax Levy of the City of Ione the year 1930.

Notice is hereby given that on Tuesday, Dec. 3, 1929, at the hour of eight o'clock, p. m. the Common Council of the City of Ione, Oregon, will meet at the Council Chamber in said city, and any taxpayer in Ione, Oregon, will be heard in favor of or against the tax levy as hereinafter proposed, which has been prepared in accordance with the provisions of chapter 118 of the General Laws of the State of Oregon for 1921, and which shows an estimate of the amount of money necessary to be raised by taxation by the City Government for the ensuing year of 1930; also showing the probable receipts of said city other than by direct tax upon real and personal property for the year 1930.
