## MRS. RALPH AKERS DIES AT THE DALLES

### Funeral Services at the Christian Church in Ione

Hester Jane Akers, wife of Ralph Akers, died at a hospital in The Dalles, Friday morning, Nov. 15, at the age of 43 years and 8 months. Funeral services were held in the Christian Church in Ione, Sunday afternoon, November, 17, and interment was made in the J. O. F. cemetery. The Reverend Paul DeF. Mortimore, pastor of the church at Glacstone, who was formerly pastor of the church here, had charge of the funeral services.

Mrs. Akers was born near Ione in the year 1886. She was married in October 1907, and united with the Christian Church in 1915. Her death came following a lingering illness. She leaves to mourn her loss, her husband, two daughters four sons, her mother, Mrs. Mary Ball, seven brothers and four sisters. The church was not large enough to seat the friends who gathered to pay the last tribute of respect to one they had known and loved. The floral offerings were many and very beautiful. Reverend Mortimore chose as the Scripture reading First Corinthians, 15, and as his text, Psalm, 116, 15; "Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of his saints." A mixed quartette sang two numbers, and the solo numbers were by Mrs. W. E. Gullard and Rev. Mortimore. The pall bearers were, Ted Trodge, Lee Howell, Edison Morgan, Bert Mason, Emil Swanson, and Tom Grabill.
