PETER BAUERNFEIND Dies at Walla Walla, Feb. 25. Funeral at Arlington

Peter Bahernfeind died in a hospital at Walla Walla, Wash., Feb. 25, at the age of 79 years. Funeral services were held, Saturday, March 1, from the Methodist church at Arlington, Rev. W. W. Head, pastor of the Congregational church at Ione officiating. Interment was made in the cemetery at Arlington. Mr. Bauernfeind had many friends here who mourn his passing. He lived for many years near Cecil. He was an uncle of Martin Bauernfeind of Morgan. A great many of the Willow Creek residents drove to Arlington to attend the funeral.

Death Occurs at a Portland Hospital, Feb. 20.
