CITIZEN'S MILITARY TRAINING CAMP

Historic Vancouver Barracks is to be the scene of the 10th annual Citizens' Military Training Camp, June 20th to July 19th, when several hundred young men from Oregon and southwestern Washington will be "soldiers for a month" and will combine military, citizenship and athletic training with thirty days of camp life at Government expense.

Any young man, 17 to 24 years of age, of average intelligence and phisic and of good moral character is eligible advises Gen. Paul A. Wolf, who has been designated to command the camp.

Young men desiring to attend this year's camp are advised to forward their applications at once before the county quotas are filled. They should consult the nearest reserve officer, American Legion post, or write C. M. T. C. Headquarters, Vancouver Barracks, Washington.
