TARIFF ON BAGS

That the tariff can become a matter of real concern to many persons is evidenced by the recent attempt of southern senators, led by senator Randall of Louisiana, to put a prohibitive tariff on burlap and burlap bags. R. E. Harbison received a wire the first of week from Senator Steiwer stating that this item had been defeated in the Senate.

The purpose of the southerners was to compel the use of cotton for containers, in the place of jute. This, of course, would have prohibited the use of all fabrics as containers for grain, grain products or any other farm produce, as a cotton bag, in some instances, would have been worth nearly as much as the contents. It is probably not generally known that New Orleans is the largest manufacturing center for burlap products in the United States.
