POMONA GRANGE NEWS

An all day session of Morrow County Pomona Grange, was held at Irrigon on April 5th with Irrigon Grange as host. During the morning an interesting business session was held at which time excellent reports were read from the subordinate granges, all being in healthy condition.

County Agricultural Agent, C. W. Smith, reported for the Agricultural Committee, their program as arranged with the Ice of the subordinate granges, to be a part of the lecture hour work for the year.

Following a lively discussion and explanation of the "Grange Exchange Bureau" a plan was adopted whereby members of the subordinate granges can exchange produce with neighboring granges or counties.

The Pomona Grange went on record as favoring the continuation of the North Morrow County Fair, offering cash prizes of \$10 and \$5 to the Juvenile Grange having the best display at the fair. At present the Rhea Creek Grange has the only active Juvenile in the county. We hope to find new interest in dormant Juveniles also to organize new granges.

Resolutions of appreciation to our Past Master, Bro. Chas. Wicklander, commending his faithfulness, to the retiring officers for their loyalty and work, and, of thanks to the Irrigon Grange for their hospitality were adopted.
