The Wheatland league opened Saturday, with Ione defeating Heppner 23 to 7. Arlington 3 wasco 4, Condon 3 Ross 2.

Ione won from Heppner by hard hitting and good base running, while Heppner was held down by good pitching and several real hitting and throwing exhibitions.

Heppner opened with three easy outs, Rietmann up for Ione hit a two bagger, F. Lundell fanned R. Lundell singled scoring Rietmann G. Swanson singled scoring Lundell and N. Swanson hit into a double.

Second inning: Gentry singled, Cason walked Merrill out short to first, Hake singled scoring Gentry and Thomson was out Akers to first.

Engelman fanned, Shipley safe when center fumbled his fly Akers knocked one into the trees for two bases scoring Shipley, Ritchie, Rietmann and F. Lundell followed with singles, R. Lundell knocked a long fly to center and the bases were cleared while the ball was being relayed to home plate G. Swanson ended the stampede by fanning.
