M. the 7th day of May, 1930, and immediately thereafter the bids received will be publicly opened by the County Court, at the County Court Room in the Court House in Heppner, Oregon, for the purchase of an issue of bonds of Morrow County for the construction of permanent roads therein in the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000), said bonds to be in denominations of Five Hundred Dollars (\$500) each, numbered 1 to 100, inclusive, to bear date, June 1, 1930, and to mature serially in numerical order at the rate of Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500) on the first day of June in each of the years 1936 to 1955, inclusive, said bonds to bear interest at the rate of not to exceed five and one-half per cent (5½%) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of June and December, principal and interest payable in United States gold coin at the office of the County Treasurer in Heppner, Oregon.
