## Pressure of Water

Iron vessels and other heavy vessels  
sink to the ocean bed, and the water  
pressure has nothing to do with hold-  
ing them up. Water is practically in-  
compressible, so that even at the great-  
est depths the water of the ocean is  
very little heavier than the water near  
the surface. The volume of the ship  
is therefore much heavier than the  
same volume of water at any depth,  
and the ship will sink. The pressure  
of a fluid is exerted equally from all  
directions and not simply upward on  
the vessel. For a ship to remain sus-  
pended halfway between the surface  
and the bottom, it would have to be  
constructed of some light material and  
have a very light cargo.
