Hazel Orval Feidman of Ione will receive her degree from Oregon State College at the sixtieth annual commencement exercises here June 2.

A total of 489 students will be awarded degrees by President W. J. Kerr in the 10 degree granting schools. The school of commerce leads with 109 graduates, with the school of engineering graduating 92 in four departments: industrial arts 12, civil engineering 24, electrical engineering 27, and mechanical engineering 29. Home economics follows with 77, vocational education 68, agriculture 39, pharmacy 30, forestry 21, chemical engineering 18, and mining engineering 7. Twenty eight graduate students will receive master's degrees.

Miss Feidman will be awarded in pharmaceutical chemistry.

She has been prominent in activities during her course here, having been a member of the Sophomore Cotillion and Sophomore Insignia committees. She is a member of Rho Chi, national honor fraternity in pharmacy, the Pharmaceutical association and has been president and secretary of the Teminid society for members of the Eastern Star. She is also a member of the Woman's athletic association and has been on the co-ed hockey, basketball and rifle teams. She is a member of Kappa Delta social sorority.

As a graduate of Oregon State College school of pharmacy Miss Feidman will be well prepared to enter her chosen field.

The institution ranks as one of the foremost state colleges in the country both in the reputation of its graduates and in the number of students. The course in Pharmacy prepares both for the practice of Pharmacy in the drug business and for scientific fields.
