



Notice is hereby given that an District No. 35 of Morrow County State of Oregon, at the school house in said school district, for the burpose of submitting to the legal voters of said district the question of increasing the sx levy for the year 1930 1931, over the amount limited by section 11, article 11, of the Constitutian of Oregon.

The reasons for increasing such levy are:

Deficit incurred by cutting of tax levy for 1930 by \$3000 which automatically results in a like dec.ease in the tax levy for 1931, Making it necessary to vote this special tax to maintain ourschool. The amount of special tax pro-

posed to be levied for said year is \$22,386.54.
