CITIZENSHIP TRAINING IN IONE HIGH SCHOOL

Point System for Evaluation To Be Used This Year

IONE HIGH SCHOOL

CITIZENSHIP CUP

In order that social, mental, and physical training for citizenship be given proper evaluation in our high school a point system is to be used this year.

Instead of merely being awarded a letter in athletics as is usually practiced, students by means of a citizenship cup are to be given recognition for accomplishments in all of these lines of activity. Everyone enrolled in High School will receive recognition.

In the recognition of citizenship four divisions of activity are to be recognized—Mental contributions, social avocational contributions, physical contributions and miscellaneous contributions.

Under mental contributions are the following:

1. A semester grade of 94-100, A.—200 points.
2. A semester grade of 86-93, B.—100 points.
3. A semester grade of 78-85, C.—50 points.
4. A semester grade of 70-77, D.—0 points.
5. A semester grade of below 70, F.—Loss of 200 points.

A student carrying 4 subjects can make a maximum of 800 points a semester for his class toward winning the citizenship cup or lose the same number. (If a student carries 5 subjects only the four lowest semester grades shall be considered.)

A semester grade in conduct of A adds 100 points, while one of B adds 50 points per individual per semester. An unsatisfactory conduct grade takes off 100 points per semester.

Under physical contributions,

1. Winning a school letter gives 80 points.
2. Making the first team in inter-scholastic football, basketball, baseball or track, but not a letter, 70 points. (First team includes 4 subs track squad and 4 subs in baseball.)
3. Second string players 50 points.
4. Participating in interclass contests per game, 5 points.
5. Custodian of team's property per sport (To win these points the property must be kept put away after each practice and game) 10 points.
6. Absence from practice, loss of 5 points per practice.

Social Avocational:

1. Leadership (2 points per hour of work plus 5 flat points per semester) This includes Pres. of Student Body, Pres. of Clubs, Business Manager, Editor of School Paper, Treasurer of Student Activity Fund, and other major offices that might be agreed upon.
2. Service (2 points per hour of work.) This group includes all subordinate offices as council officers, class officers, newspaper officers.
3. Membership (1 point per hour of attendance.) This includes membership in any organization or club not included above.

At the end of the school year a faculty committee of all class sponsors shall add all points. The class having the largest total shall be declared the winner of the cup. This the president of the winning class shall be awarded commencement night by the Principal. The cup shall be the permanent property of the school and shall be kept in a conspicuous place at all times.

A record of the number of points earned must be kept by the secretary of each class who must turn a list into the office at the end of each 6 weeks period.

1. Assemblies, 3 points for each participation.
2. Plays, 15 points for each (not more than 2 per semester.)
3. Extra duties, Library duty or office duty 1 point per hour.
4. Attendance 1-2 point per day, 1-2 point more if not tardy.
5. Debate team, 100 points. Class debate 50 points.
6. Declamation tryout, 50 points; alternate 80 points. Sub-district winner, 300 points; 2nd, 200 points; 3rd, 100 points. District winner, 500 points; 2nd, 400 points; 3rd, 300 points. Inter-County winner, 1,000 points; 2nd 800 points; 3rd, 600 points.

Membership in any organization or club not included above.

4. Church attendance per Sunday 50 points, Sunday School attendance 50 points.
- Miscellaneous. Special duties for which no school credit is given.

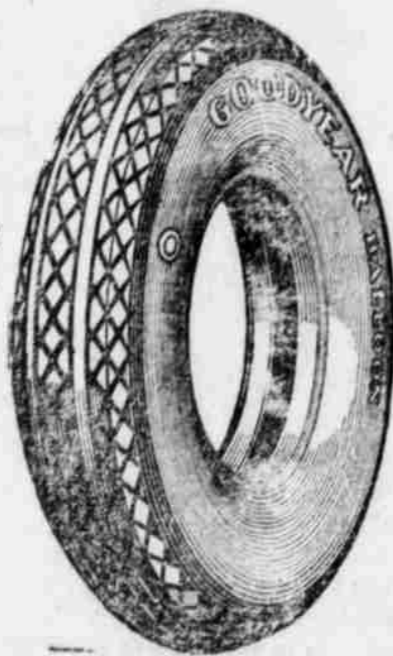
