IONE-LEXINGTON GAME

Ione Wins First Football Game by Score of 19-0

Ione, Sept. 26.—The Lexington football team met the Ione team on the home field here today. The game proved to be very exciting although the score of 19 to 0 in favor of Ione, was very uneven. Even though they were being beaten badly, the Lexington boys kept fighting to the end of the game. Throughout the entire game the ball was never back of Ione's forty yard line.

Ione scored the first touchdown in the second quarter and the second touchdown in the third quarter but were unable to convert either. In the last quarter Norman Everson scored a touchdown by falling on the ball after it had been fumbled and rolled over the goal line. The ball was successfully kicked across the line for the point by Johnnie Eubanks.

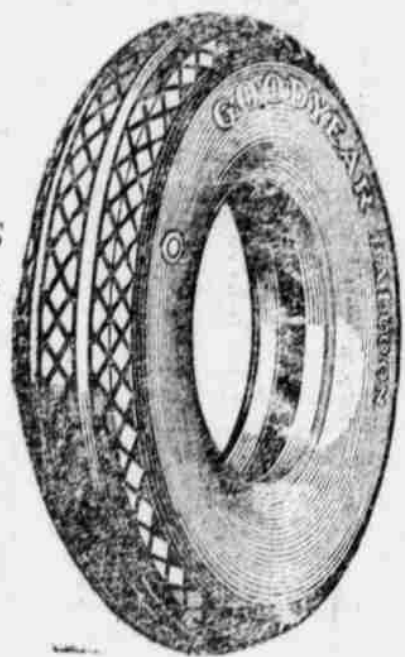
