Without their being identified he slipped articles into the Courant under the name of "Mrs. Silence Dogood." Parading behind the mask of a shrewd middleaged widow this sixteen-year-old boy carried on a moral and intellectual crusade, including an attack on "scollars" at Harvard college, Already Pranklin knew how to mix light, amusing observations in serious discussions without falling into burlesque, and he avoided bitterness.
