IONE DEFEATS CONDON 26-7

Ione received the ball on her ten yard line. It was returned to the thirty yard line by McCabe. A couple of poor punts let Condon get within scoring distance twice in the first quarter but Ione's line kept them from scoring and then Ione received the ball and punted out of danger.

In the second quarter Ione started a determined march for Condon's goal until Ione bucked the ball over the goal line. The attempt to convert failed making the score 6-0 at the end of the first half.

In the third quarter Morgan recovered a Condon fumble putting them within scoring distance. McCabe made the touchdown on an off tackle smash. Late in the third quarter Ritchie blocked a punt which Ely recovered behind the Condon goal line, giving them their third touchdown. A pass, McCabe to Eubanks, was responsible for the extra point. In the fourth quarter Condon completed two long passes putting them within reach of the Ione goal. They bucked it across for their lone touchdown; they converted. Late in the fourth a long pass thrown to Everson by Swanson put Ione on Condon's 30 yard line from there Ione put it across for their final score; it was converted.

Ione was threatened in the Condon goal line as the final whistle blew.

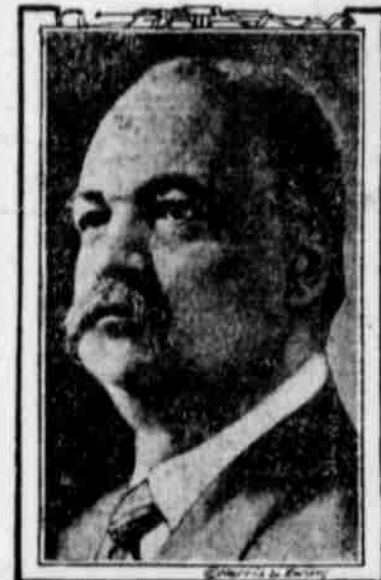
The playing of Ritchie, Swanson, Eubanks, and McCabe evoked much praise from the sidelines.
