ELECTION RESULTS IN IONE CITY VOTE

J. P. LOUY MAYOR ELECT

GEORGE FRANK RE ELECTED
MARSHAL FOR FOURTH TIME

The city election passed off very quietly with results as given below. Interest was chiefly centered on contests for the mayoralty and marshalship, Mr. John P. Louy being chosen for mayor by a narrow margin and Mr. George Frank for marshal by a decisive majority. The vote cast was distributed as follows:

For Mayor: John Louy 56; Bert Masco, 53; Recorder: W. W. Head, 91; Frank Robinson, 10. Treas.: Craco Linn, 97; scattering, 3. For Marshal: George Frank, 84; P. J. Linn, 24. Councilman for four yr.: John Bryson, 97; Lee Howell, 88; E. R. Lundell, 91; scattering, 5. For Councilman for two years: Ture Peterson, 65; Ted Troge, 63; J. W. Howk, 50; scattering, 3.

Also showing the probable receipts of said city other than by direct taxation upon real and personal property for the year, 1931.

Carnegie Hero Fund Com.
Makes Award of Medal

The Carnegie Hero Fund Commission has ordered a bronze medal sent to Mr. and Mrs. Hallick Stange in recognition of the heroism of their daughter, Eva Stange. Miss Stange lost her life in a vain effort to save Glenn Robison from drowning in the Columbia River at Alderdale Ferry in Aug. 1929. Mr. and Mrs. Stange live at Longview, Washington. Last summer a representative of the Carnegie commission visited Ione and from Mr. and Mrs. I. R. Robison, parents of Glenn learned the story of the tragedy.
