

The city of Worcester, Mass., has the distinction of being the first city in the world where a large full multiple common battery central telephone office switchboard was installed. It was placed in service on June 20, 1896. Worcester is now served by a dial telephone system

Messina Rightly Claims Most Wonderful Clock

Messina, one of the most important towns in Slelly, is regaining the glories it lost in the appalling earthquake some 22 years ago. One of the most striking of its new buildings is a tower which contains the most wonderful clock in the world.

The tower is surmounted by a bronze Hon holding the city flag in its front paws. At midday the iion lashes its tall, waves the flag, and roars. A bronze cock placed below the flon crows a greeting to sunrise, noon, and sunset. Two arched recesses contain the bells upon which the hours are struck by figures of Diana and Clarenza, the heroines who save the city from being sacked by the French after the Sicilian Vespers in 1282.

On each of the four sides of the tower is a luminous dial eight feet in diameter upon which are displayed the masses of the moon, a propert of calendar, and the movements of the planets round the sun.

Below the clock face is a stare upon which mechanical figures enact scet a appropriate to the great feasts of the church .- London Tit-Bits.
