WIN DOUBLE-HEADER

With an eight point lead piled up in the first few minutes of play the Lexington High boys were affronted by Ione's snappy come back which resulted in the score being tied, 8-8 before the first quarter of playing was over. Executing a tight defense as well as a powerful offense the Ione boys ran their score to 15-8 before Lexington in the third quarter of play scored two field goals, bringing the score to 15-12 at the end of the game.

The Ione boys have shown marked improvement in playing since the beginning of the season. In the pre-season practice game with Lexington they lost by quite a large margin; in the first conference game with Lexington Ione lost by one point but redeemed themselves by turning the tables Friday evening. Only one league game remains to be played and that with Boardman at Ione. Lexington is awarded the district championship, having lost only one game in the conference series.
