

PROCLAMATION

Saturday, May 23d, was pronclaimed Poppy Day in a proclamation issued Thursday by Mayor John P. Louy. The proclamation urges all citizens of the city to observe the day bo wearing an American Legion and Auxiliary popy as an individual tribute to the American men and women who gave their lives in the World War. It also calls upon the citizens of the city to contribute as liberally as their means will allow to the welfaree of the disabled veterans and devendent families of the dead anddisabled when purchasing their poppy. The proclamation follows:

"I, John P. Louy, Mayor of the City of Ione, remembering the fine young men of Ione whom the city sent forth in the years of 19e7 and 1918 to defend the honor and ideals of our nation on the battlefields of the world's most terrible war, and who died in the heroic performance of the duty the nation assigned to them, and deeming it fitting that the citizens of the city should pay honor to their memory by wearing the flower among whose bright red blossoms many of them died, do hereby proclaim Saturday, May 23, Pobj Day.

"I nrge that this day be observed by all patriotic citizens of Ione by the weoring of the memorial poppy made by disabled veterans which will be offered on the streets of the city by the women of the America nLegion Auxiliary. I further urge that the citizens of Ione who gave so gallantly of their services and so liberally of their wealth during the war, think on this day of those who gave health and strength, and when purchasing a poppy, give as liberally as their means will allow to help lighten the burden for those who are still paying in suffering and poverty the price of our glorious victory.
