Eacho Wants to Incorporate

At the next meeting of the county commissioners, held at Pendleton some time in January, that body will be petitioned by Echo citizens here for the privilege of incorporating the town. Some of the business men tried to get such a scheme through the last session of the legislature, but it was defeated.

The town has grown rapidly during the past year. It is estimated there are from 300 to 400 residents. The rabbit canning factory and new lumber company adds to activity.

Some of the citizens are carrying on strong agitation for a new school building. The present one is old and rather cold for the children in the winter time. Several months ago the question of issuing \$1,500 bonds for the construction of a new building was carried, but there was a defect somewhere and another election will be held December 12, at which time the amount of the proposed bonds will be increased to \$3000.

The foundation of the proposed building was started when the question of the first bond issue carried, and was completed, but the work had to be stopped. The contracts for the other parts of the building have also been let, and if the question again carries at the coming election work on the structure will be started immediately, with the hope of completing the building by the latter part of February. At present the school has an attendance of 60 children.
