The Ralston Land & Stock Company is the name of a new organization of Portland capitalists, who have secured option on about 1500 acres of land near Arlington which they propose to irrigate from artesian wells.

The American Wool and Cotton Reporter, the publisher of which was until the last election an officer of the National Woolgrower's Association, says the recent meeting of the association in Portland was the largest convention of sheep men ever held in the United States.

While Oregon is practically solid for Roosevelt, let us not overlook the fact that in the political centers of the East he has opposition that will have to be reckoned with. Roosevelt as president, by his fearlessness and forcefulness, has endeared himself to the common people; but in so doing he has run amuck of corporat interests, uncomfortable snags in his own party.—Eugene Register

According to the Vancouver Columbian the Clark county prune growers will probably have to hold their crop over a whole year, owing to the depressed market. The price of prunes is very low and no buying. The bulk of the crop is still in the packing houses with no indications of a change in the market. The result will be that hundreds of acres of prune trees will be dug out the coming

season and the land used for other and more profitable crops.

The announcement of candidates is about the first evidence that interest in the coming campaign is beginning to liven up. The organization of the Roosevelt Club in this city Saturday evening will also have a tendency to warm up the political atmosphere in Morrow county somewhat. While there is little being said thus far there is known to be a number of aspirants for at least a few of the county offices and naturally the forecast is that there will be some spirited, though friendly contests before the convention.

Last Monday the county clerk turned over to the sheriff the 1903 tax roll for collection, and the sheriff and his deputy are busy just now sending out statements to the tax payers of Morrow county. It will be remembered that the same old tax law is in force, which embraces the following conditions: Three per cent rebate is allowed if all the tax is paid before March 15th; the first half is delinquent after the first Monday of April; the last half is delinquent after the first Monday of October. Delinquents will be charged 10 per cent penalty and 12 per cent interest. These are important things to remember.

The Pendleton Commercial Club should have the hearty support of all Eastern Oregon towns in its efforts to induce the various railroads to grant stop-over privileges in the states of Oregon and Washington to the visitors of the Lewis and Clark fair during 1905. A resolution has been adopted to that effect by the Pendleton club and other cities will be asked to join in the movement. This is another reminder that Heppner should have some kind of an organization to further the interests and upbuilding of our town and county. The O. R. & N. will doubtless be very willing to grant stopovers along its line in Eastern

Oregon as its interests will be augmented by the development of this section of country. This company is now gathering data for the extensive advertisement of the resources of our county and if it succeeds in bringing a large number of visitors to our city and county their decision to locate and become permanent residents depends largely upon the manner in which the good hand of fellowship is extended by our people. But there are numerous other ways in which a commercial club can be of much more benefit to its town and surrounding country than in the reception of prospective home-seekers. It can assist in the advertisement of our abundant resources, and there are a hundred and one ways that it can benefit the town and aid in its upbuilding, if its membership is made up of live and energetic citizens.
