Senator Marcus A. Hanna did at the family apartments in the Arlington hotel, Washington, Monday evening at an illness extending over nearly two months. He was born in Ohio in 1837 and descended from a pioneer family of that state. He came into public life about ten years ago and was sponsor for the political success of President McKinley.

Every law-abiding citizen will agree with the Long Creek Light in its statement that the wrecking of the Ranger office with dynamite was the most cowardly treachery. Admitting that the editor of the Ranger was guilty of unwarranted criticisms, there are other means of obtaining justice than to stab a man in the back at night without warning. Nothing more dastardly can be conceived.

By an oversight we failed to mention in the last weeks issue of the Times that Mr. Geo. Conser had been appointed by Governor Chamberlain as a member of the Lewis and Clark fair commission to succeed C. B. Wade, who recently resigned. We feel that we owe this apology to Mr. Conser, as it is one of the purposes of the Times to give favorable mention to any worthy citizen of our town or section who has been elected to a position of honor and trust; and we assure him that it was an oversight. Mr. Conser is in every way qualified for the position, and we

feel safe in saying that Morrow county's interests will be carefully looked after at the 1905 fair.

The question of annexation of a portion of northern Grant county to Morrow county is being agitated by the Grant county people. It appears the people residing in the strip want to be annexed to Morrow county for the reason that their interests are more closely identified with this county. The proposed strip, as we understand it, extends the full length of Morrow county on the south side and as far north in Grant as the town of Hamilton. Within this strip there is said to be some very rich territory which would make a very desirable acquisition to our county. But on the other hand it is said that Grant county is burdened with a debt of considerable magnitude, which should be carefully considered by our people. The Times admits that it is not sufficiently familiar with the country over there, its present wealth and resources, to base a reliable conclusion as to whether our county would be benefited or worsted by the proposed annexation. It is a matter that should be thoroughly looked into before any steps are taken in either direction, either to take it up or to ignore the proposition. It might be well to discuss the matter and ascertain whether or not the proposition has sufficient merit to justify its earnest consideration.

Gambling Dens Raided
District Attorney Hailey, in company with Sheriff Taylor and Deputy Sheriff C. P. Davis, armed with the necessary warrants, made a raid on the gambling establishments of Pendleton last Friday and arrested every man connected with the games. Warrants to the number of 39 were issued and nearly all of which were served.
The entire list was arranged before Judge Ellis Saturday and fined \$50 and \$75. District Attorney Hailey says he is determined to stamp out gambling, and will do so regardless of the Pendleton city administration, which is said to be favorable to a wide open town.
