Governor Chamberlain expresses the opinion that the matter of securing a right-of-way for the Dalles-Celilo canal will be adjusted soon, now that the O. R. & N. is said to be favorable to the plan, as they have been convinced that it will not interfere with their interests. Negotiations are reported to be progressing rapidly and all conditions lead to the belief that the desired right-of-way will be secured without any obstacles in the way of litigation.

The drastic measure passed by the Washington legislature compelling breeding cattle shipped into that state to pass a tubercular test, is working a hardship on the breeders of both Oregon and Washington. The large breeders in the state will not submit to such a law, which prohibits the Washington breeders buying high-class cattle right at home. Had the breeders of Washington been organized, we predict that no such law would have ever passed. The stockmen of this county must get together and keep together if they are to make breeding profitable, and not let a few men who are seeking notoriety ruin their business.—Rural Spirit.

There seems to be a growing apprehension of a great war as a result of Russo-Japanese imbroglio. Recent events has led to the belief that the relations between France

and Russia are a great deal closer than the public had reason to believe. England is closely watching every move of France and is preparing for eventualities. Should these powers become involved and their dogs of war once turned loose other complications would arise and other powers be drawn into the fray, and there is no telling where or when it would end or what the result would be. Leading men of the world are apprehensive of a great world war and foresee the need of conservative statesmanship. They realize that each a-pring nation with ambitious rulers are eager to extend their territorial possessions and add to the glory of his own reign. Especially are complications liable to arise with European powers where there are frequent opportunities for irritation.

The people of the rapidly growing little town of Irrigon, on the Columbia river, want a wagon road to the county seat. They claim that by the present train schedule on the main line that they can go to Portland as quickly as they can get to Heppner, and that there is little chance of shortening the time except by opening a wagon road. There is a road already opened the greater portion of the way and at little expense a road can be made connecting that town with the county seat. It would be an advantage to Heppner business men if this road were opened as it would afford the people of the north end a shorter and less expensive route to reach our city. It will bring these people here offener and will naturally bring more trade to the Heppner merchants. There is said to be thirty or more families in Irrigon and in that section covered by the Oregon Land & Water Company's ditch, and it will be only a few months until as many more have bought land under the ditch and become residents of Morrow county. Heppner should be entitled to a share of this trade and with proper efforts can without question secure it.
