O. says: "The wool market in Umatilla county will be favorable to the growers just as they stand by their organization and observe the binding obligation to hold their wool until sales day. If the cream is skimmed off by private purchases before the sales, the remainder must be sold low, and the strength of the organization in protecting its members is wasted. Stand by your union. The market is organized against you. Organize to meet it."

Irrigon Prospering.

Geo. J. Currin, Republican candidate for county judge, and A. Andrews of Heppner, report having made a pleasant visit to the new town of Irrigon on April

30th These gentlemen are loud in their praise of Irrigon and its industrious and enthusiastic citizens to whom they were introduced by Mr Bennett, editor of the Irrigator, and Mr Holbrook, manager of the Oregon Land & Water Company.

Mr. Currin gives us the following account of what he found: The country about Irrigon is rapidly filling up and being converted from a desert into a country of pleasant homes. Much land is under cultivation and thirty thousand trees and vines have been planted this spring beside a great deal of small fruit. The Oregon Land and Water Company keep a force of 30 men and 20 teams constantly at work upon their property. The large ditch which furnishes water for irrigation is now running an abundance of water for a distance of 9 miles out from where it taps the Umatilla river. 300 settlers have purchased land under this ditch and adjacent to Irrigon and a promising community is fast building up.

Irrigon has a good hotel, general merchandise store, hardware store, cigar store, barber shop, an up-to-date and enterprising newspaper and many other requisites of a prosperous town. With the energy and push of the people and the excellent resources of the country, Irrigon will in a few years be second to no similar community in Oregon. Our citizens ought to be acquainted with and appreciate the additions in population and wealth which this community is adding to Morrow county.
