Mrs. Bryant Enters Race for Superintendent

Mrs. Emma Bryant of Hillsboro this week announced her candidacy for the office of state superintendent of public instruction to succeed J. A. Churchill, resigned. She will enter the May republican primaries, and has this to say:

"I am forty-two years of age, a married woman and the mother of four children, three of whom are attending college in this state and one attending high school. St. Paul, Minnesota, is my birthplace, but I was reared in the city of Portland, Oregon, coming there at the age of five years. I attended the public schools of that city, being a graduate of the old Portland high school located at Fourteenth and Morrison streets.

"I have had many years of experience in the rural schools of this state and the state of Washington as well as experience in the city schools. I have served as principal of a city school and am now serving my fifth year as superintendent of schools of Washington county.

"One of the big problems before the people of Oregon today is to devise a more equitable tax division for school administrative purposes. If elected, I will put forth all possible effort to meet this problem, and will do my utmost to further all the educational interests of the state. Another big problem which will occupy me will be the problem of equalizing educational opportunities between the urban and the rural child.

"I am a member of the Congregational church, of the Women's Auxiliary to the Spanish-American War Veterans, of the local county and state grange, of our local Women's Club and Parent Teacher Association. I am president of the State Association of County School Superintendents."
