Forecasts of Wheat Production,

Estimates and forecasts of wheat production, outside of Russia and China, indicate that the world's sup-ply will be close to that of last year, while the demand is stronger because ness of low stocks of old wheat and other grains and a short wheat crop in the Orient. Estimates of production in twenty-one countries of the Northcin Hemisphere indicate a produc-tion of 2,351,000,000 bushels as com-pared with 2,230,000,000 bushels last year. These countries last year pro-duced 78 per cent of the total production of the northern hemisphere and 70 per cent of world production, exclusive of Russia and China.

Reporting Service Improved.

The agricultural extension service of the O. A. C. and the federal bureau of agricultural economcis will cooperate in crop and live stock reporting service for Oregon. Duplica-tion of work will thus be eliminated and special local service will be furnished where needed.


