Wild and satyr like lusts, holy longings, prickings of conscience, bonds of obligation, remorseful faces from the past, rosy plans for the future all mingle in the strange phantasmagoria behind the soul.

Greater than any music that Wagner ever composed is the music that he dreamed, but could not express. Greater than any speech that a gifted orator has made are the speeches he thought of, but never made.
