Wool Growers Plan To Hold Ram Sales

Pendleton will be the scene of a ram sale Aug. 18 at which time rams from different parts of Oregon and Idaho will be on sale here. On the evening of the sale, the Oregon Wool Growers association will have a mid-summer meeting. A banquet will precede the meeting of the wool growers. This will be the first time a sale of this nature has been held in Pendleton, and as the ram is considered half the flock, many are expected who have not yet sent in their names. Those who have names to sell may send their names to the Oregon Wool Growers association, Pendleton.

The rams for the sale will be mostly range rams. The Cunningham Sheep company of Pilot Rock will have Rambouillet and Cross Breeds, Alfred Smith also of Pilot Rock has signified his intention of bringing Delaines. Those who have made known that they will bring Hampshires are Carl Whitman, Wallawa; W. H. Dobbin, La Grande; Mrs. Minnie Miller, Thousand Springs, Idaho; Charles Howland, Cambridge, Idaho; Frank Brown, Carlton; Dave Waddell, Amity; and W. E. Link, McMinn-

ville. James Laidlow of Bellevue, Idaho, will bring Suffolks and Panamas.

The Lincoln growers of the Willamette valley have evidenced interest in the plans and are expected to have several rams on hand for the sale.

The date of August 18 is subject to change in case of conflict with the ram sale at Salt Lake.
