

FARM MARKET TREND

Corvallis, Oregon, August 29, 1927.—GRAIN. Favorable crop conditions in Canada caused some weakness in the wheat market early last week but good export demand resulting from delayed harvest and lowered condition of the European crop strengthened the domestic markets again at the close. Premiums for high protein wheat continued firm and good quality low protein wheat such as soft red winter and some varieties of Pacific coast white wheats in strong demand in St. Louis territory where prices advanced 2 cents during the week on soft winter and placed that market in line for receiving wheat from the Pacific Northwest where wheat is now moving heavily into export channels. The rye market was firm on good export demand. Corn remains firm in anticipation of a short crop and oats and barley were steady, cash barley being firm and prices a little higher at Pacific coast markets last week on good export interest.

GRASS SEED. Kentucky bluegrass seed is moving out of growers' hands slowly at the lowest price since 1916, the average being about 68 cents per bushel in Kentucky and 85 cents per bushel in Missouri about the middle of August. Orchard grass seed is also moving out slowly at prices about in line with a year ago or an average of \$1.50 per bushel of re-cleaned seed in Kentucky, \$1.25 in Missouri and \$1.20 in Virginia.

LIVESTOCK. Good killer and feeder cattle were firm but poorer kinds scarcely steady in most markets. Hogs were unsteady with prices tending stronger on desirable killers and weaker on pigs in eastern markets. Fat lambs were steady in local markets but went sharply lower in the east on heavy receipts which were sorted heavier. Feeding lambs met a strong demand at steady prices.

BUTTER. 92 score butter at San Francisco advanced from 45 cents to 46 cents per pound last week, where receipts were less than current requirements and some storage butter was taken out. Prices advanced in eastern markets also.

FEEDS. The tendency of feed prices is generally upward as a result of high prices for corn and other feed grains.
