

ST. PATRICK'S CHURCH.

Next Sunday will be the first Sunday in September, the fourteenth after Pentecost, and services on that day will be conducted at the home of Frank Nixon, who has charge of the Heppner Water works. The service will consist of mass at 9 o'clock, celebrated by the pastor in the open air, and he will preach at this mass. No other mass will be celebrated anywhere in the parish, and the invitation is extended to all to assist at this service. The pastor expects a great crowd to attend, and after this service, the congregation may disperse and spend the day as best pleases them. Light refreshments will be served but no formal meals or luncheon served. Everyone is advised to bring along a lunch basket. Children are especially invited to attend.

On the second Sunday of September, that is, September 9th, there will be mass in the home of Mr. and Mrs. Peter Slavin of Boardman at 10:30; the pastor will preach at this mass. On the same Sunday, there will be a first mass in the church in Heppner at 7:30. Beginning with the third Sunday of September, the hours for mass on Sundays in Heppner will be changed. That the people in the different missions and stations may know the Sundays on which mass will be said, the pastor here announces officially, that on the first Sunday of each month, there will be mass in Lena; on the second Sunday, mass in Boardman; on the third Sunday, mass in Ione; on the fourth Sunday, mass in the Sands. Owing to the service next Sunday in the mountains and it being the first Sunday of September, there will be no mass in Lena until the fifth Sunday of September, that is, September 30th. Mass will be said every Sunday in Heppner, at hours announced weekly in the Gazette Times.
