A SAFEGUARD OF PUBLIC FUNDS.

(Astorian-Budget)

RECENTLY an Oregon newspaper made a reader-interest survey using what is known as the "Gallup system," to determine for its own guidance and benefit the type news, advertising and features which appealed most to its readers It may be surprising to some to know that the monthly "exhibit of claims of the county court" was read by a large majority of the sub-

scribers surveyed. This revelation indicates a com mendable interest in public business by the public of this particular and we doubt not that the county exhibit of claims of other counties command as much interest.

The law requires each county clerk to publish a statement of all claims authorized by the county court and ordered paid each month The purpose of the law is to acquaint the interested citizens with the expenditures of the county, to advise them as to just how and for Times, what the tax money is being spent. It was one of the wisest laws ever enacted from a standpoint of safeguarding public funds and insuring them against waste, extravagance and misuse. When the controlling body knows that it must account publicly for every cent it spends and that every citizen is to be given the opportunity of scrutinizing ev-ery item of expenditure, there is a natural tendency to be careful and and warrants ordered drawn






