The New Postoffice.

HEPPNER has become aroused to the need for and possibility of obtaining a new postoffice. Letters from many prominent citizens are being sent this week to congressmen and representatives, setting forth the case in its behalf.

That Heppner is in the eligibility class of offices with \$5000 or more receipts is shown by figures quoted by Charles B. Cox, postmaster, for the last five years, as follows: 1930—\$8,588.53, 1931—\$8,017.25, 1932—\$6,508.10, 1933—\$7,261.57, 1934—\$7,909.21.

With the fact established that Heppner needs, and is entitled to a new postoffice, there remains the question of how extensive a building should be provided to house it.

In building for the purpose it is only logical that the government should provide for other activities carried on here, including the forest service and department of agriculture work.

At the present time the government pays rentals totaling \$150 a month for these activities. This amount would pay interest at 4 per cent on a \$37,500 building.

From the showing it is therefore logical to ask for a building costing between \$30,000 and \$40,000. Such an expenditure is within the realm of business economy for the government and would be a welcome asset to our little city.
