The New Postoffice.

HEPPNER has become aroused to the need for and possibility of obtaining a new postoffice. Letters from many prominent citizens are being sent this week to congressand representatives, setting forth the case in its behalf.

That Heppner is in the eligibility class of offices with \$5000 or more receipts is shown by figures quoted by Charles B. Cox, postmaster, for the last five years, as follows: 1930-\$8,588.53

1931-\$8,017.25 1932-\$6,508.10 1933-\$7,261.57 1934 \$7,909.21

With the fact etablished that Heppner needs, and is entitled to a postoffice, there remains the question of how extensive a buildshould be provided to house it.

In building for the purpose it is only logical that the government should provide for other activities carried on here, including the forest service and department of agriculture work. These activities take in the Umatilla National forest office and the office of county agent. latter being headquarters for all agricultural control work.

At the present time the govern-

ment pays rentals totaling \$150 a month for these activities. This amount would pay interest at 4 per cent on a \$37,500 building. Present upkeep expense of the offices would probably take care of other overhead expense of a new building.

From the showing it is therefore logical to ask for a building cost-ing between \$30,000 and \$40,000. Such an expenditure is within the realm of business economy for the government and would be a wel-come asset to our little city.


